The application deadline for fall 2018 enrollment and consideration for up to four years of funding is **December 1, 2017.**

Our graduate program enrolls almost 100 students in both master's and doctoral degrees and our student community boasts representation from many parts of the nation and world. Graduate students work closely with faculty advisors and fellow student scholars to develop their research and teaching skills in a collaborative environment.

We seek to recruit students passionate about research, interested in working on faculty grants, and deeply curious about communication theory and application. Current and recent graduate students have published single and co-authored publications, received awards at national and international conferences, and been honored for their undergraduate teaching. Graduates of the program go on to success at research universities, teaching colleges, and industries where academic expertise is valued.
